Prior to course registration, you and your faculty advisor will submit a Course Substitution Request form for approval by the Dir. of Basic Degree Studies.**
- D. **Faculty Advisors will use the most recent version of the MPS, SCP Certificate program tracker. It is updated annually to reflect any additional courses added to the program.**
