Program trackers provide advice and guidance but are not official college documents. Students are responsible for comparing the tracker with their ACORN record and program requirements as detailed in the Knox College Handbook.

Instructions: Twenty credits in the degree. All MPS (Spiritual Care), and MPS, SCP Certificate students will complete the courses in Section One (7 credits), Section Two (8 credits) and Section Four (1 credit; a course from Section Three may be substituted). The remaining four credits for MPS, SCP Certificate students will be in section Three. MPS students not pursuing registration with CRPO will take the remaining four credits as a combination of courses from Section Three, Four and Five. Open electives are ONLY available to MPS students not registered in the SCP Certificate and/or not pursuing registration with CRPO.

NOTE: Students are accepted into the MPS program. They must do a second application to be accepted into the MPS, SCP Certificate, which is the recognized program for training in psychotherapy by CRPO. Students apply through the TST website before April 30th for registration in the SCP Certificate in September. Application requirements include completion of a minimum of five courses and acceptance into a summer or fall practicum (conditional acceptance for the latter). Students must complete at least one course after registration in the SCP Certificate and registration cannot be retroactive.

Course Substitutions for Program Requirements require approval by Faculty Advisor and Director of Basic Degree Studies. Please complete and submit the Course Substitution Request form for approval prior to course registration.
